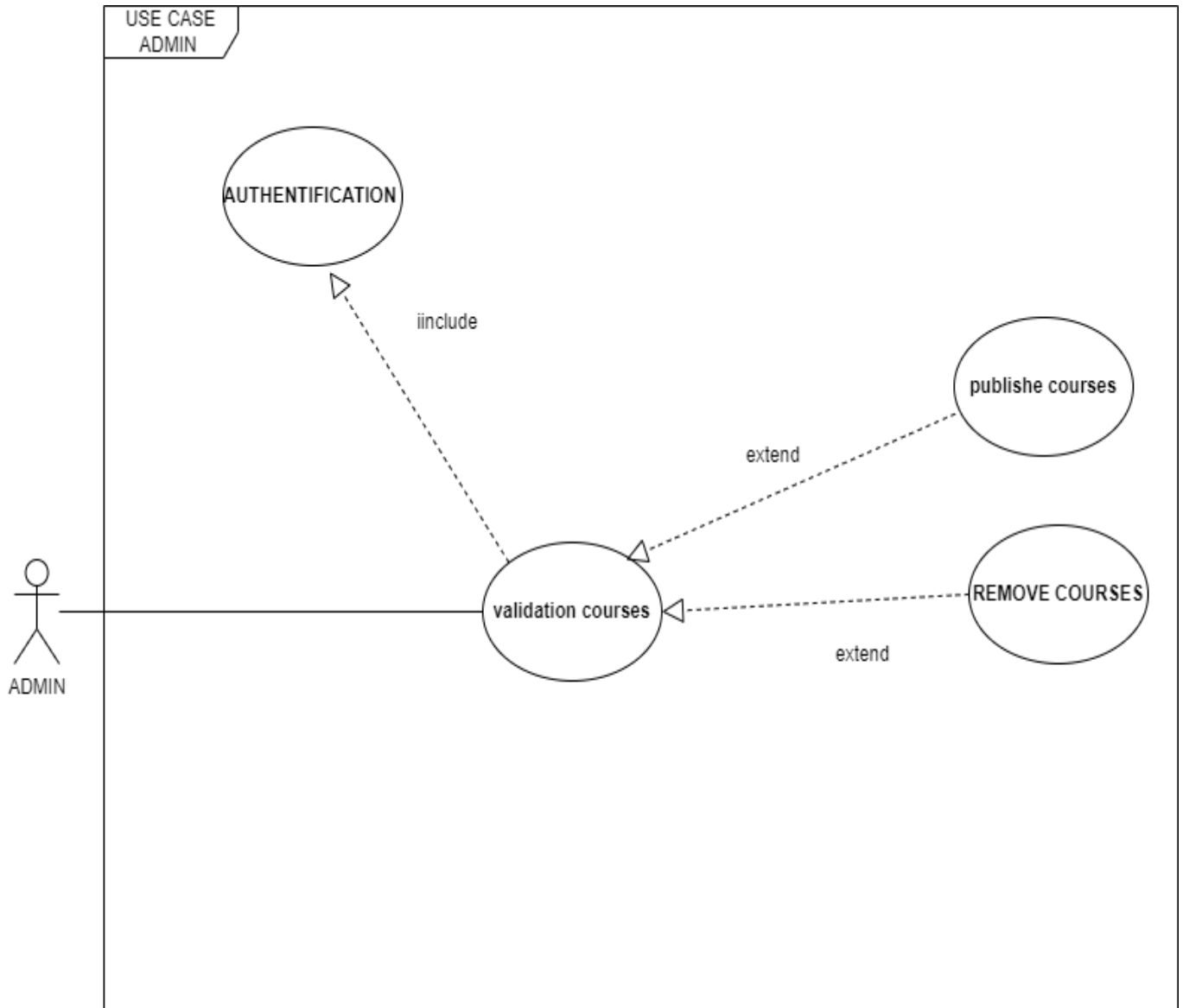


Figure 2 : admin use case

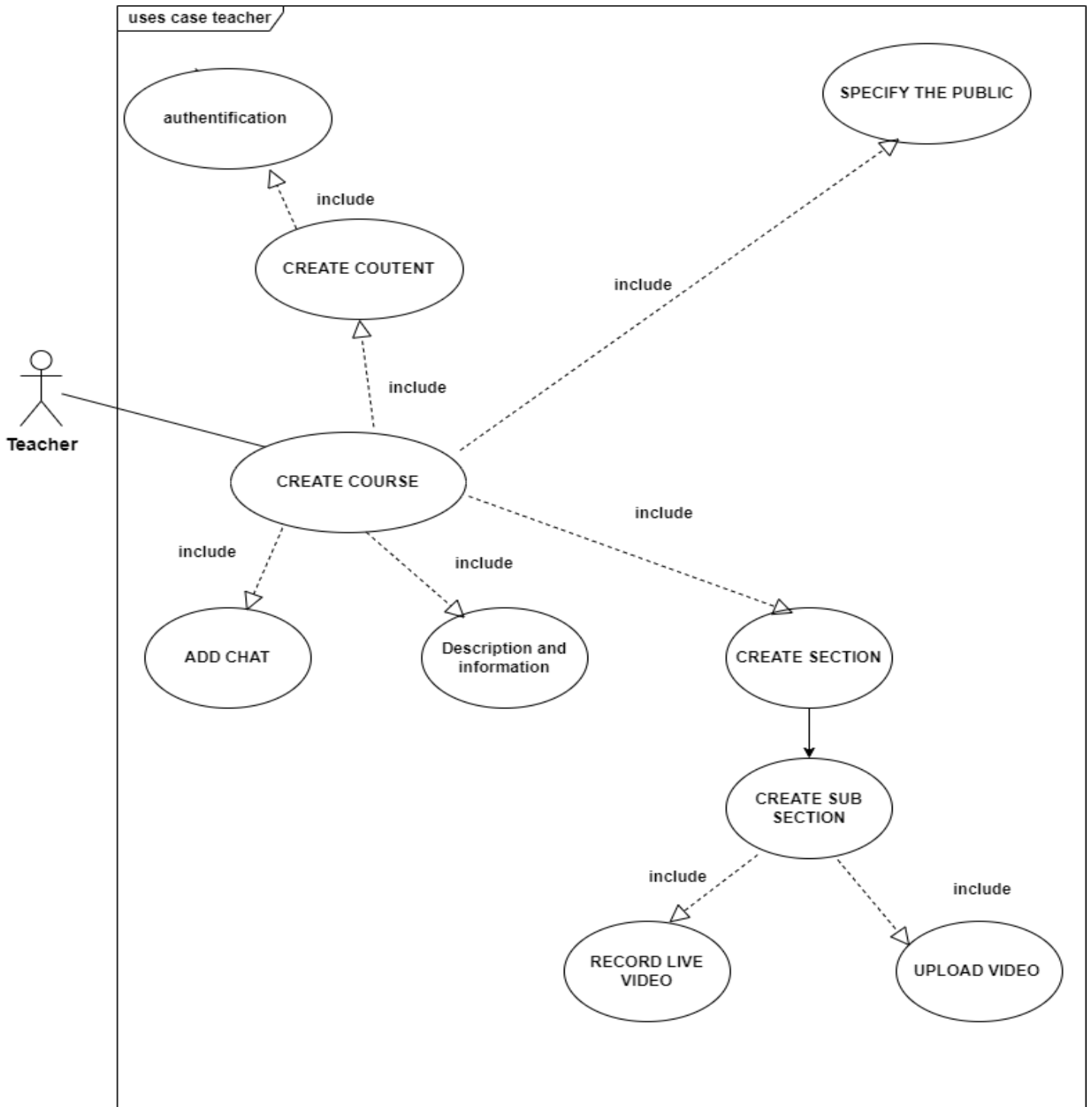


Figure 3: Teacher Use Case

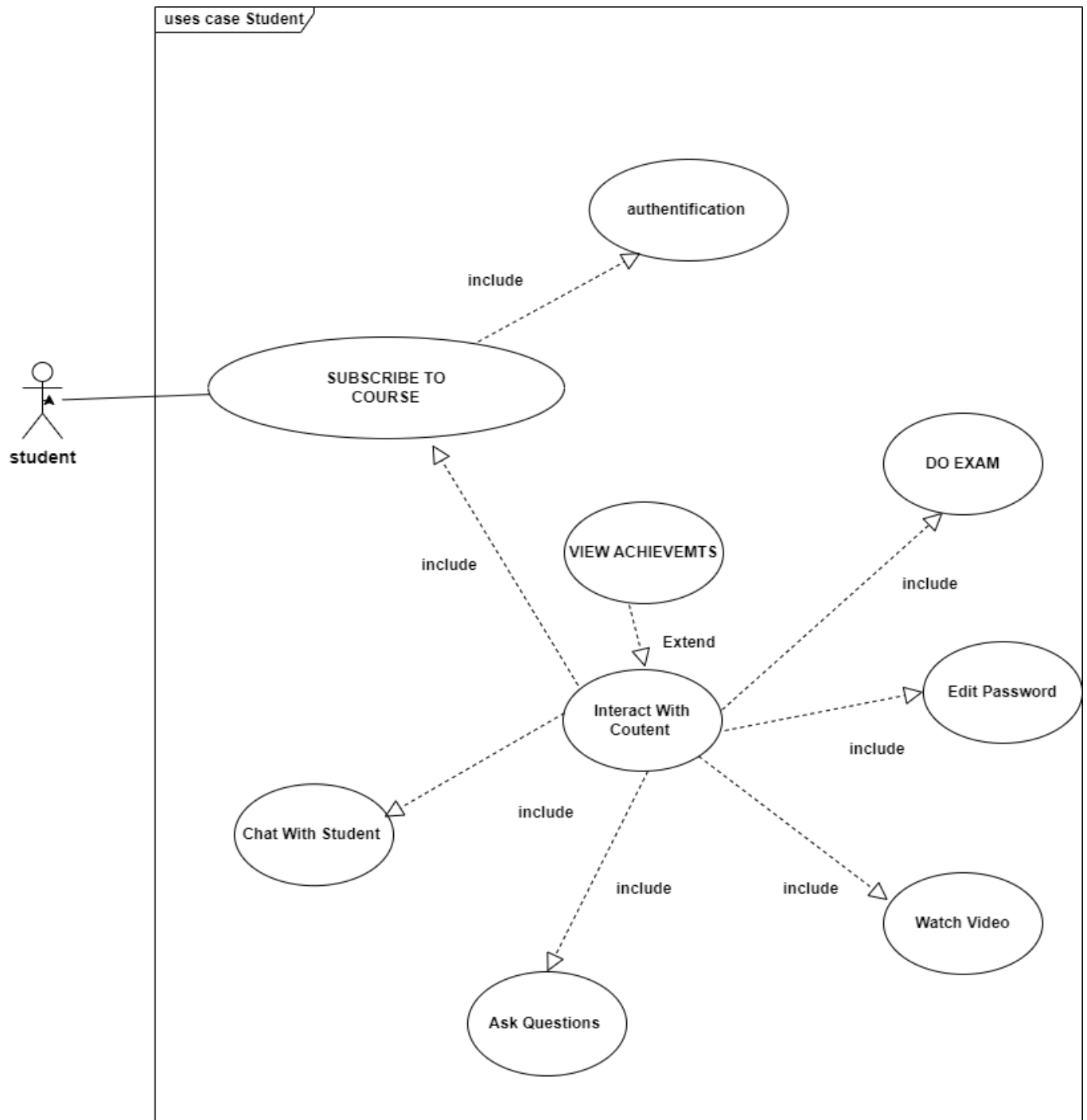


Figure 4: student use case

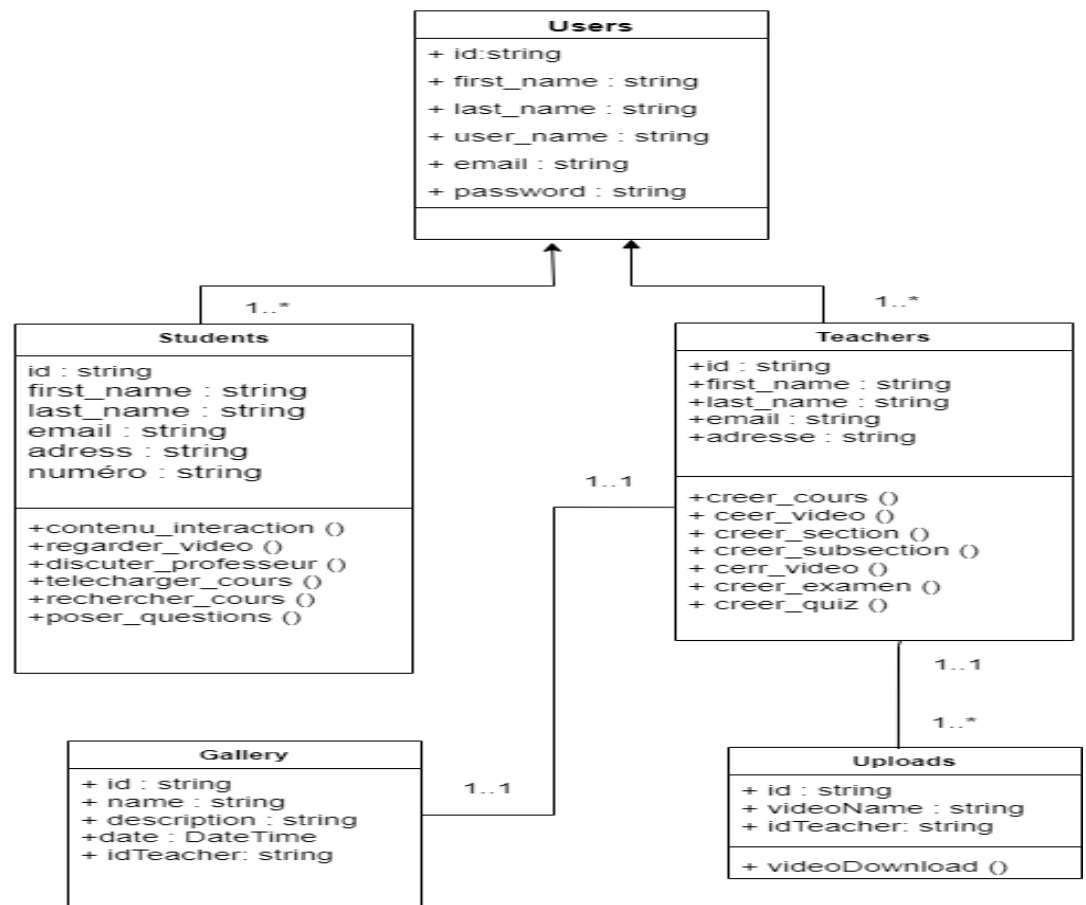


Figure 5 : Class diagram

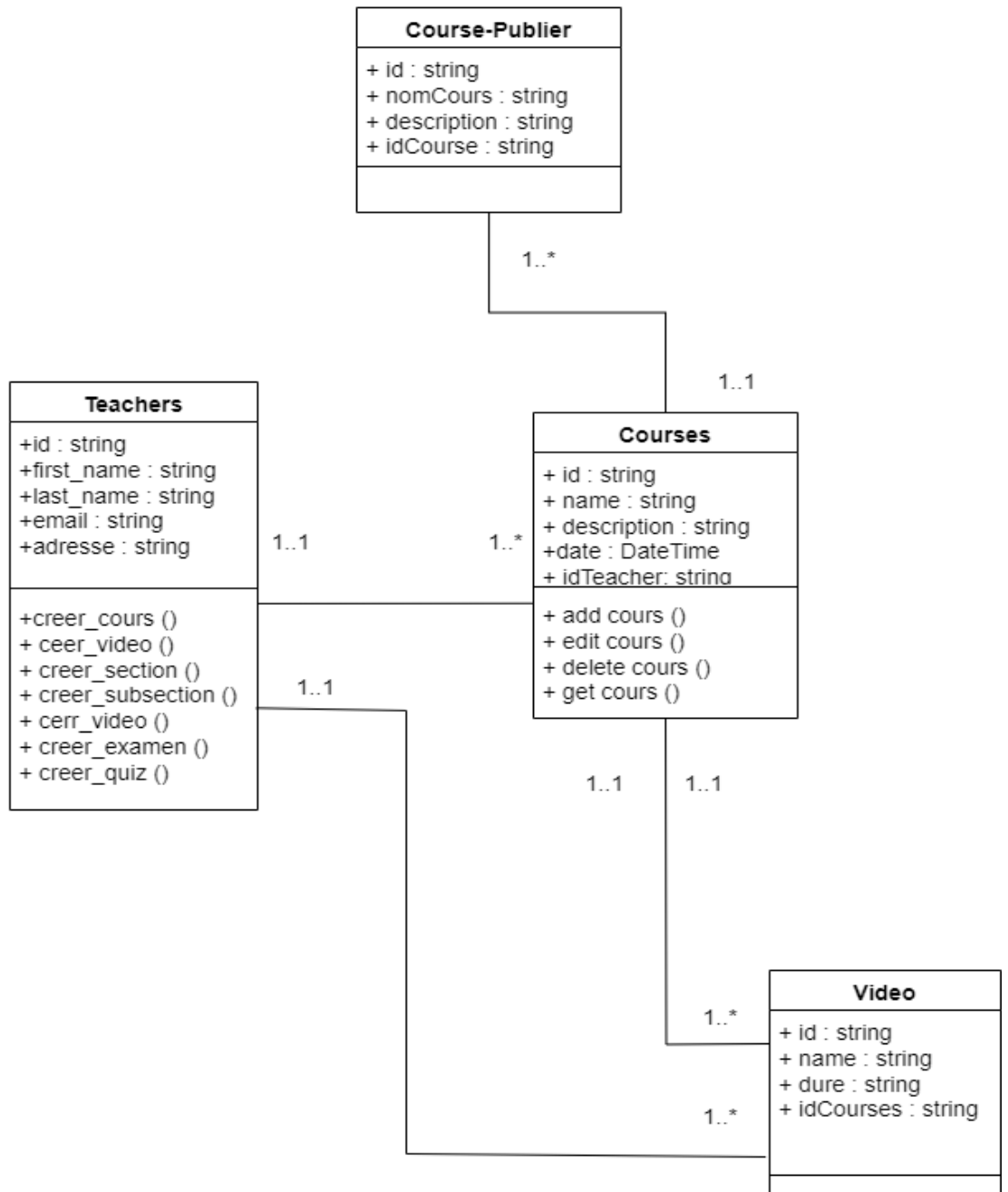


Figure 6 Class diagram

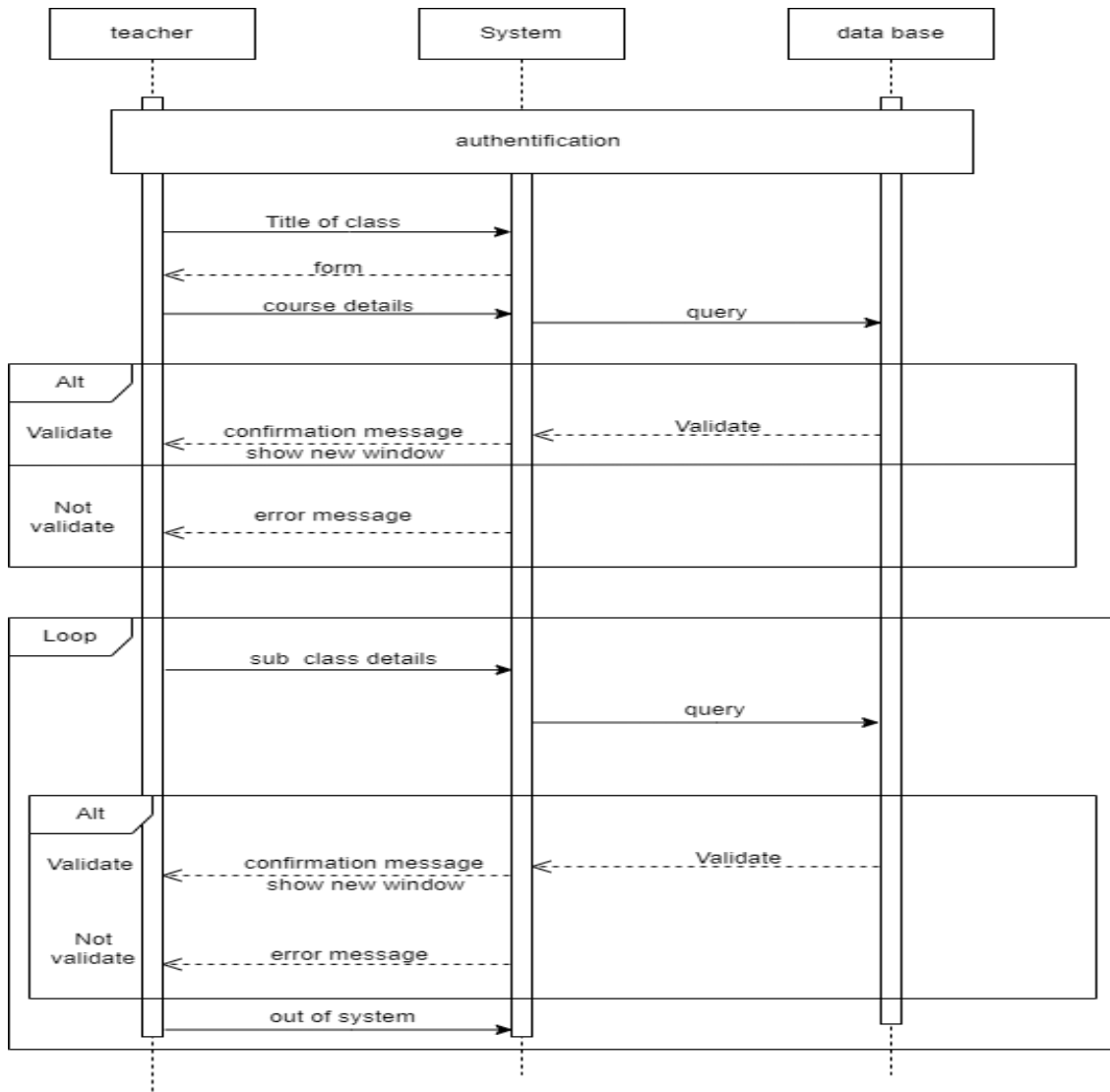
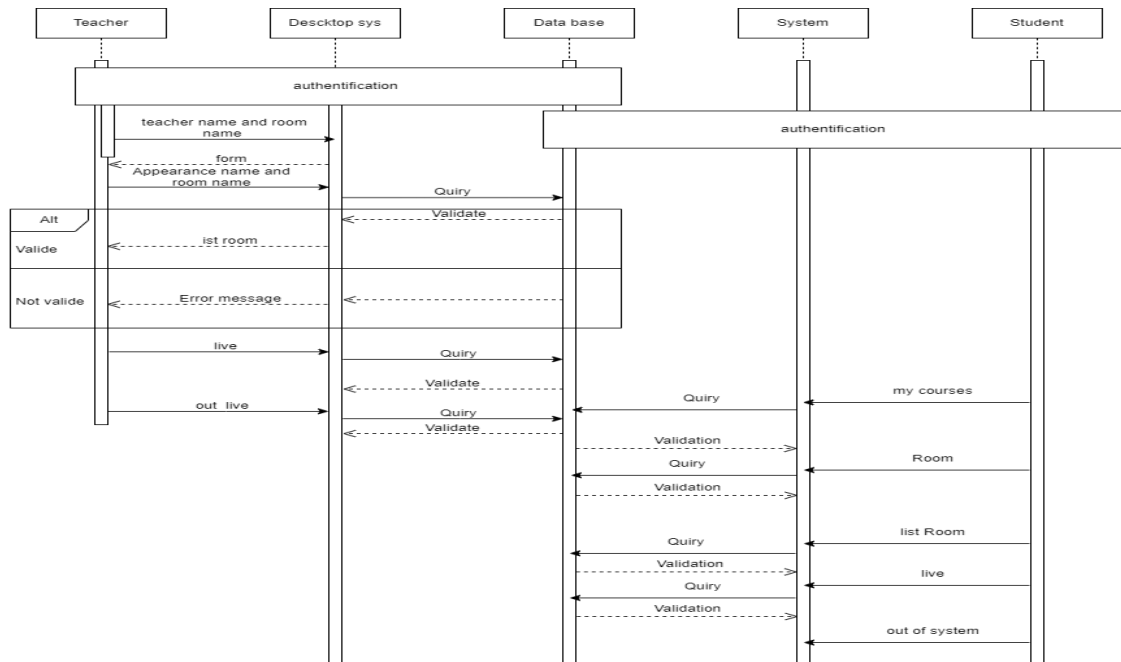


Figure 7: Sequence diagram Add Course

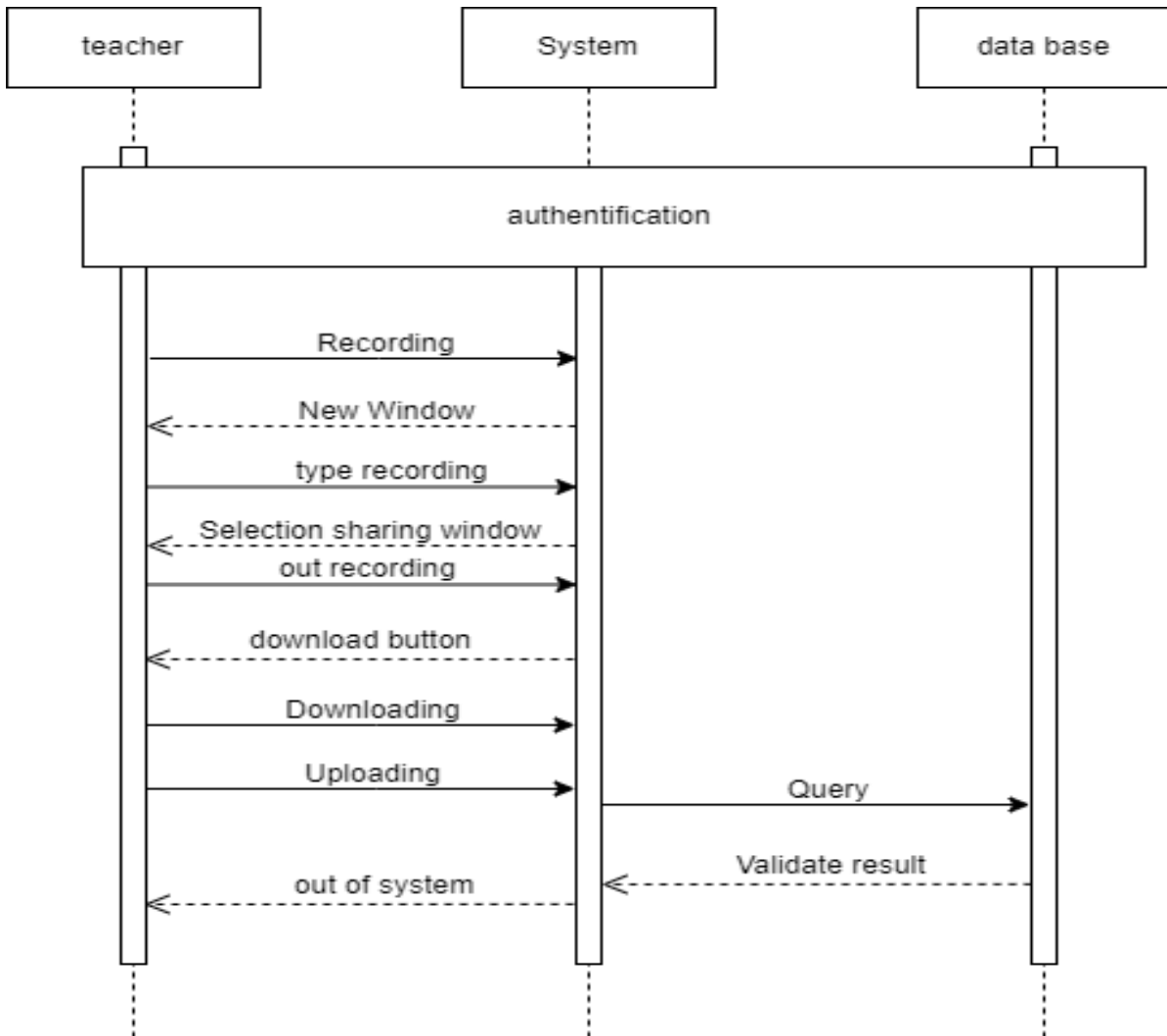
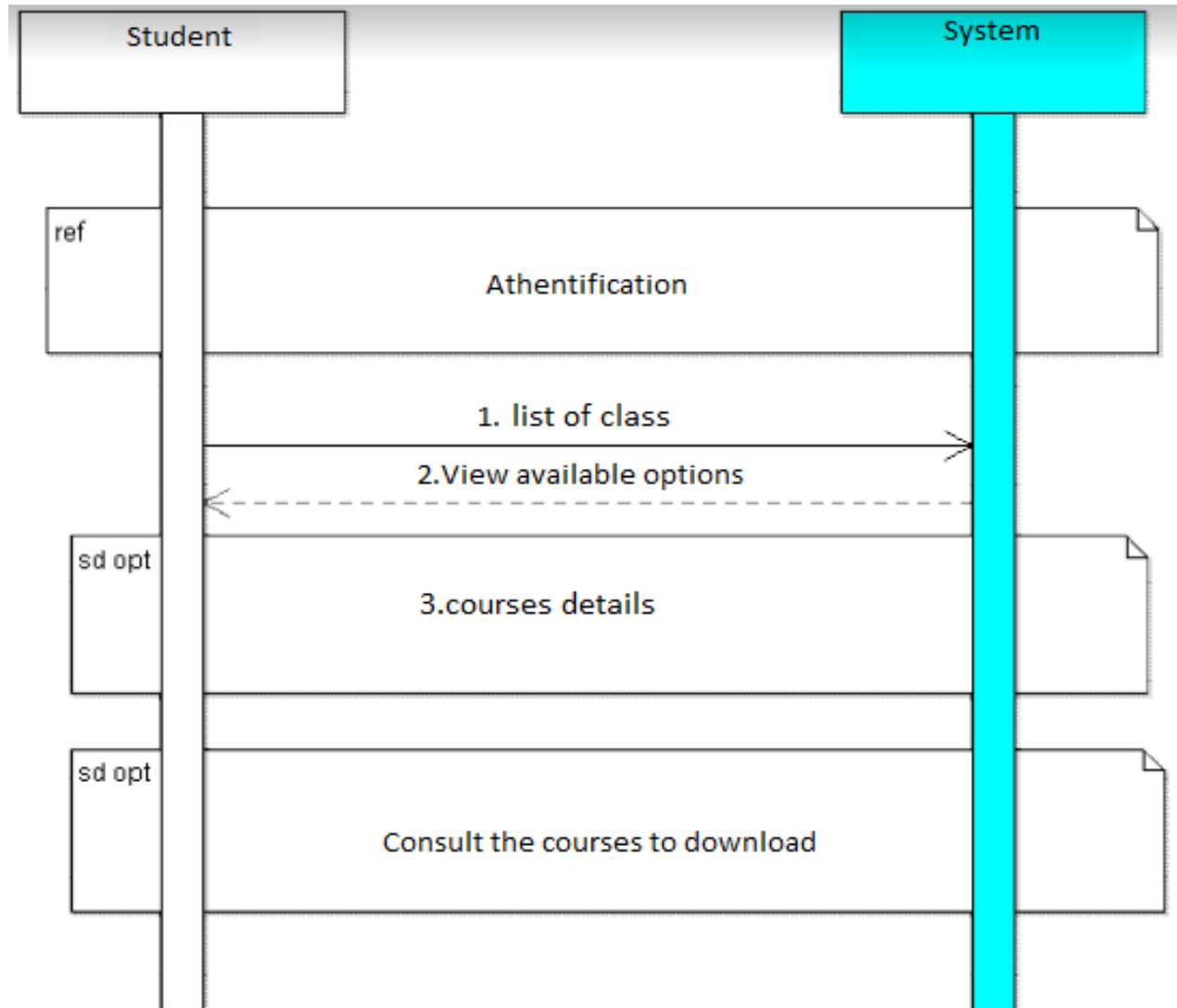


Figure 9 : Sequence diagram: Record and upload video

### **6.2 The Development Tools:**

#### **6.2.1 Presentation Of The Development Tools:**

##### **6.2.1.1 XAMPP:**

XAMPP stands for Cross-Platform (X), Apache (A), MySQL (M), PHP (P) and Perl(P). It is a set of software allowing to setup easily a Web server and an FTP server. It is a distribution of free software

Apache MySQL Perl PHP) easy to install offering a good flexibility of use allow the exploitation of an Apache server, the MySQL DBMS and the PHP interpreter. XAMPP is also cross-platform, meaning it works equally well on Linux, Mac, and Windows. [19]

### **6.2.1.2 Apache Server:**

Is an HTTP server created and maintained within the Apache Foundation. used mainly on Internet hosting in Linux, although it can also be used in Windows [20]

### **6.2.1.3 MySQL:**

Is a database management system (DBMS). As an Open relational database server Source, Based on Structured Query Language (SQL). Also MySQL is most commonly associated with web-based applications. [21]

PHP (HyperText Preprocessor) is a programming language programming that integrates into your HTML pages. Among other things, it makes it possible to make repetitive tasks automatic,

in particular thanks to the communication with a database (the most common use of PHP). [22]

### 6.2.1.11 PhpStorm :

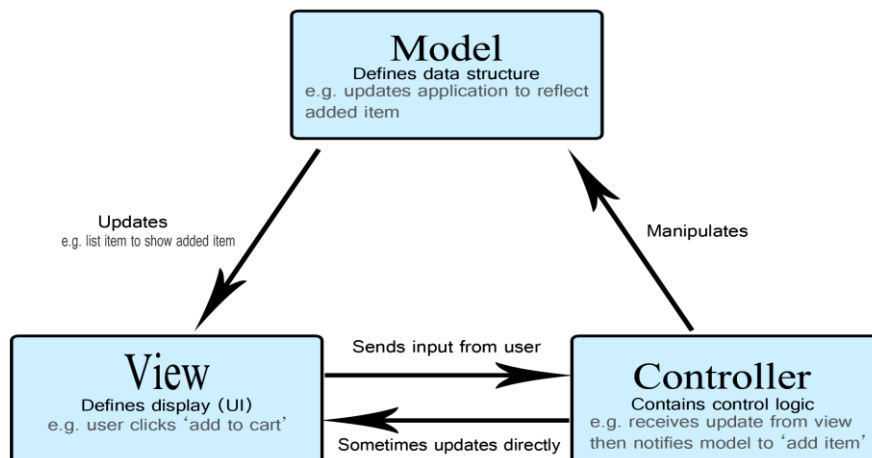

- + Information entry forms; these forms can be submitted to several times for confirmation or reporting errors

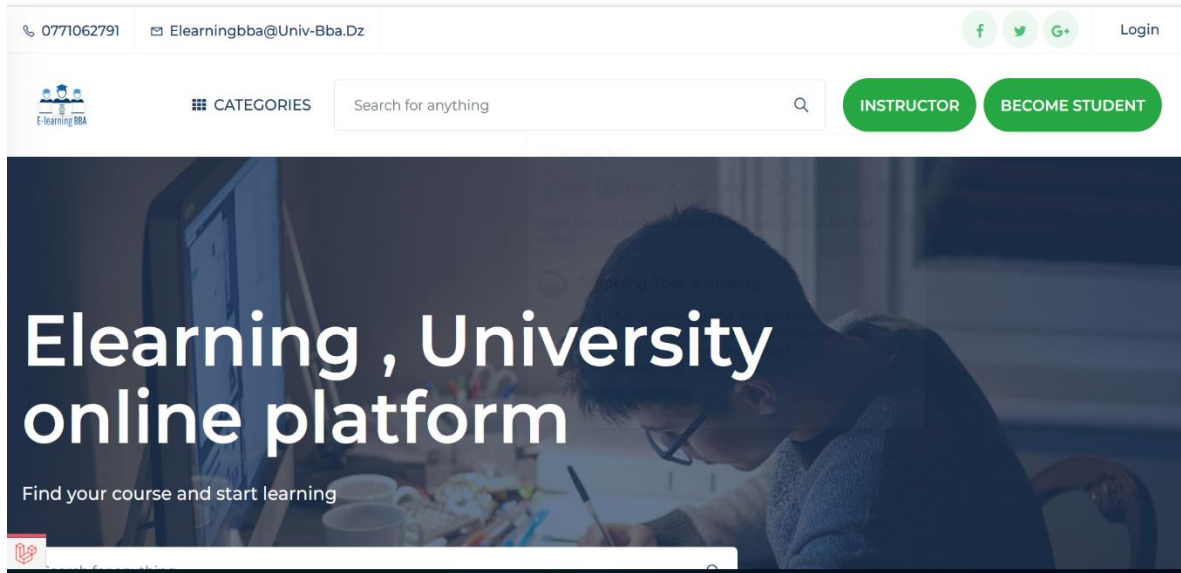
### **6.3.2 The Controller**

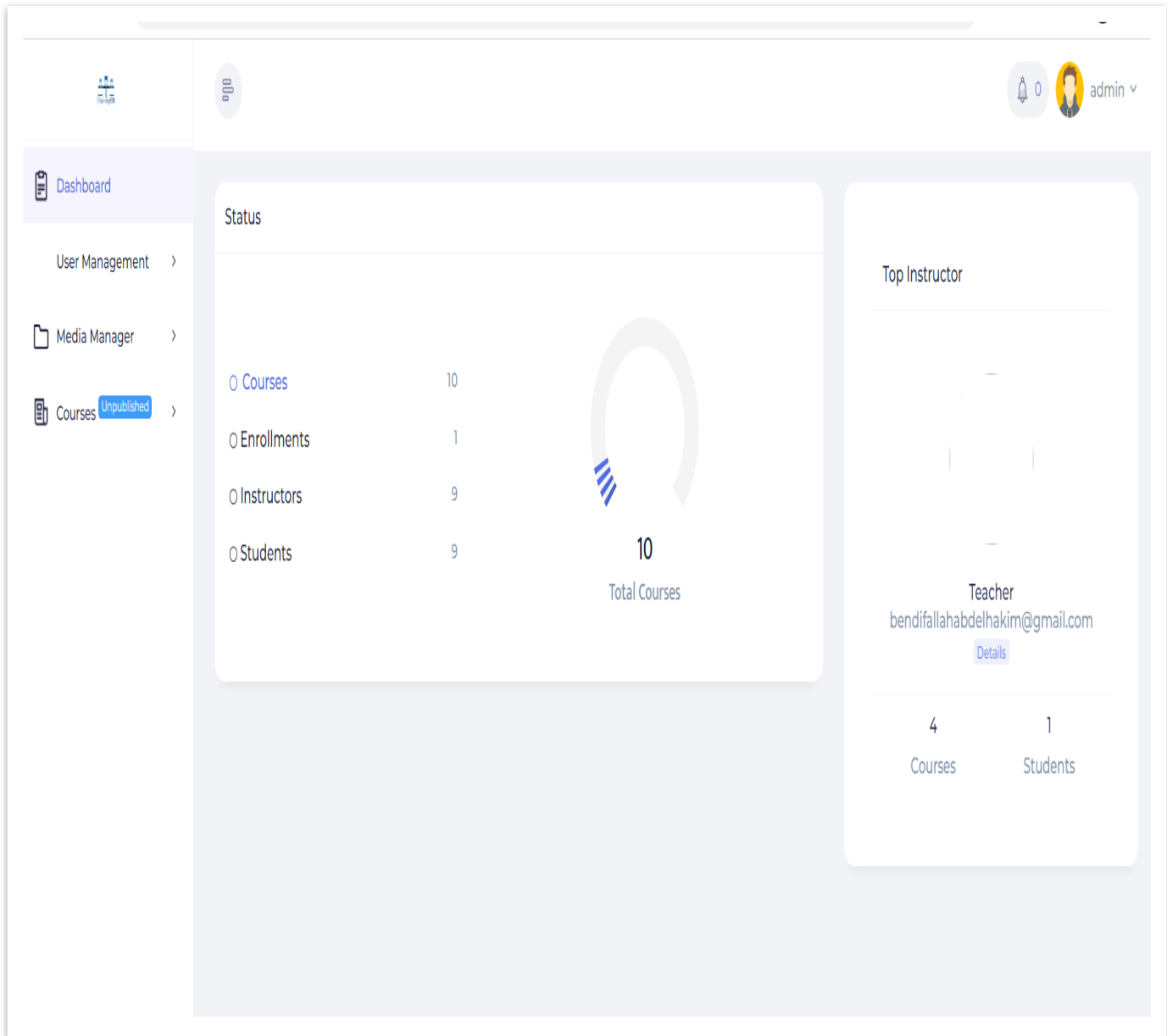

**Figure 12 Home page of our E-Learning platform.**

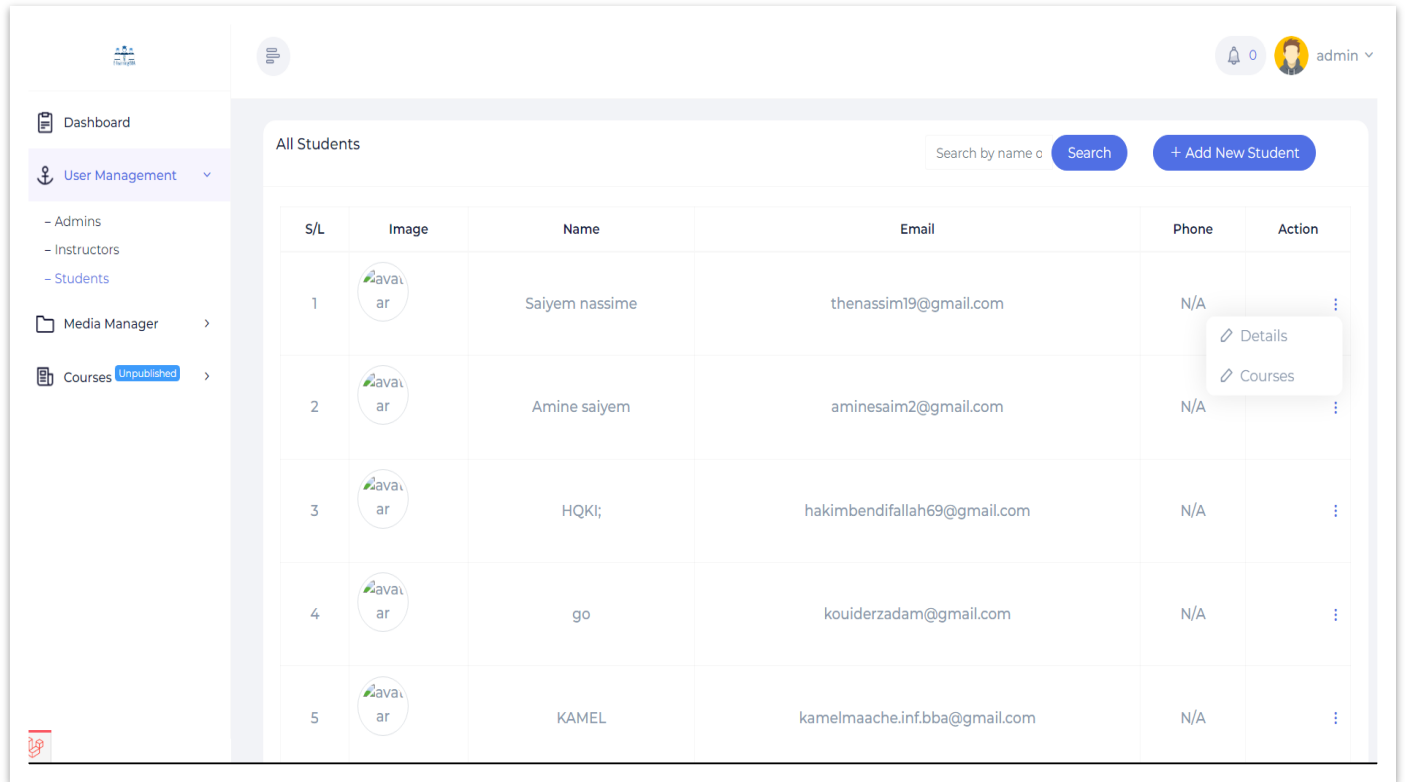

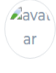




**Figure 13: dash board**

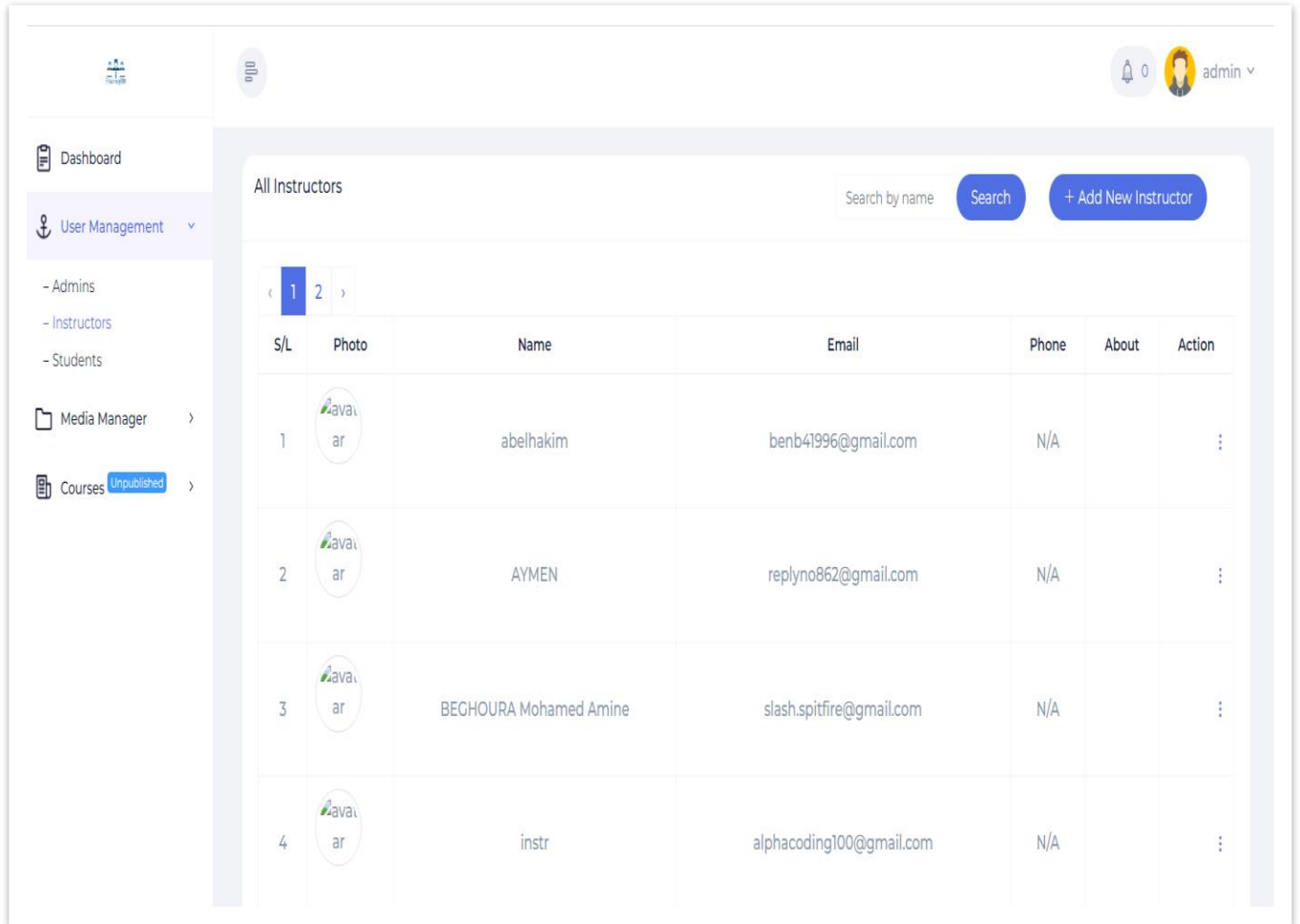

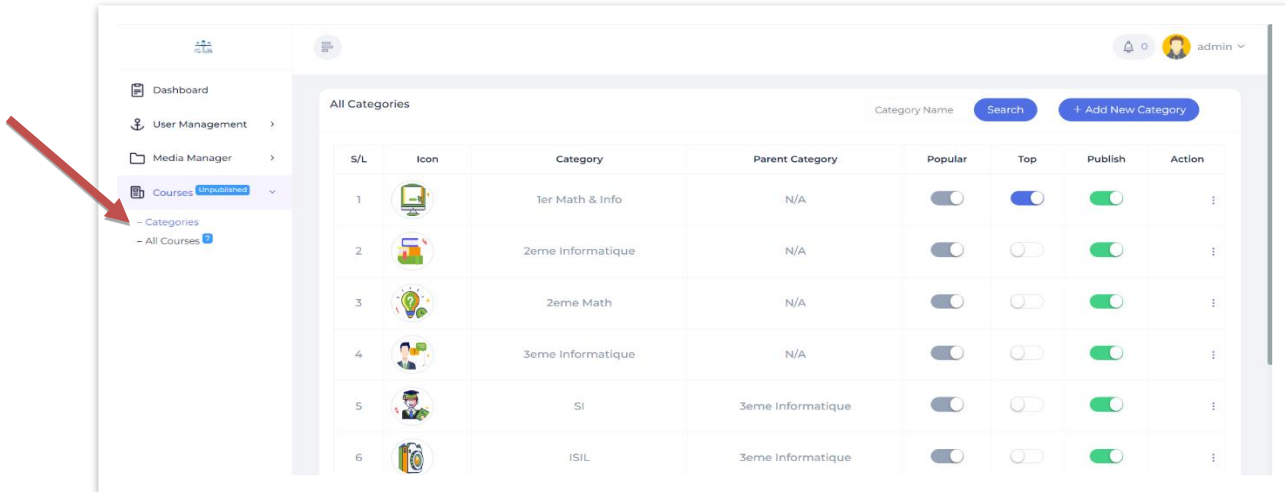


Figure 16 : courses posted

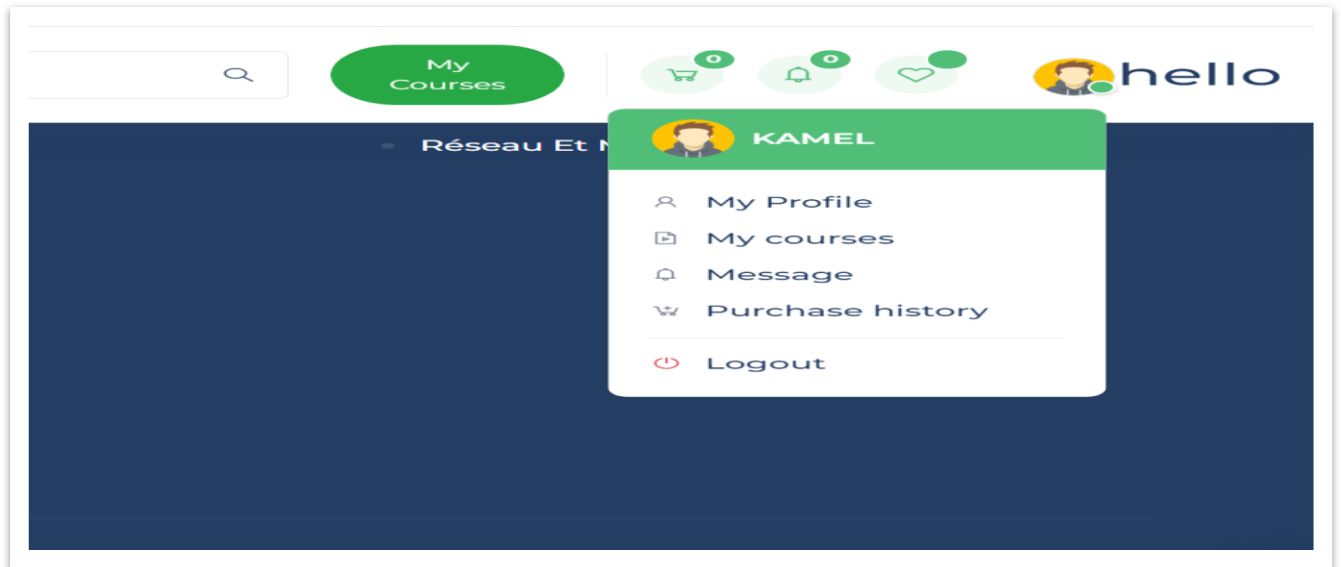
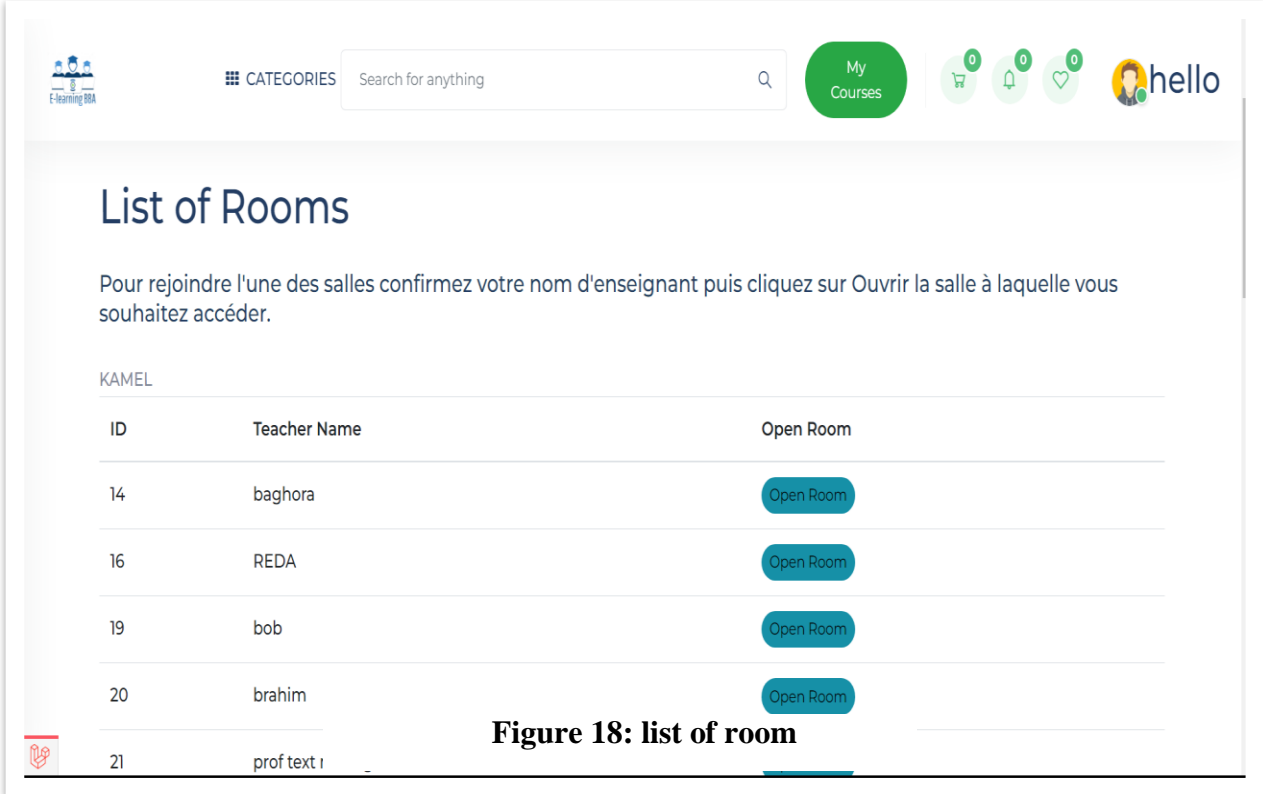


Figure 17 : profile

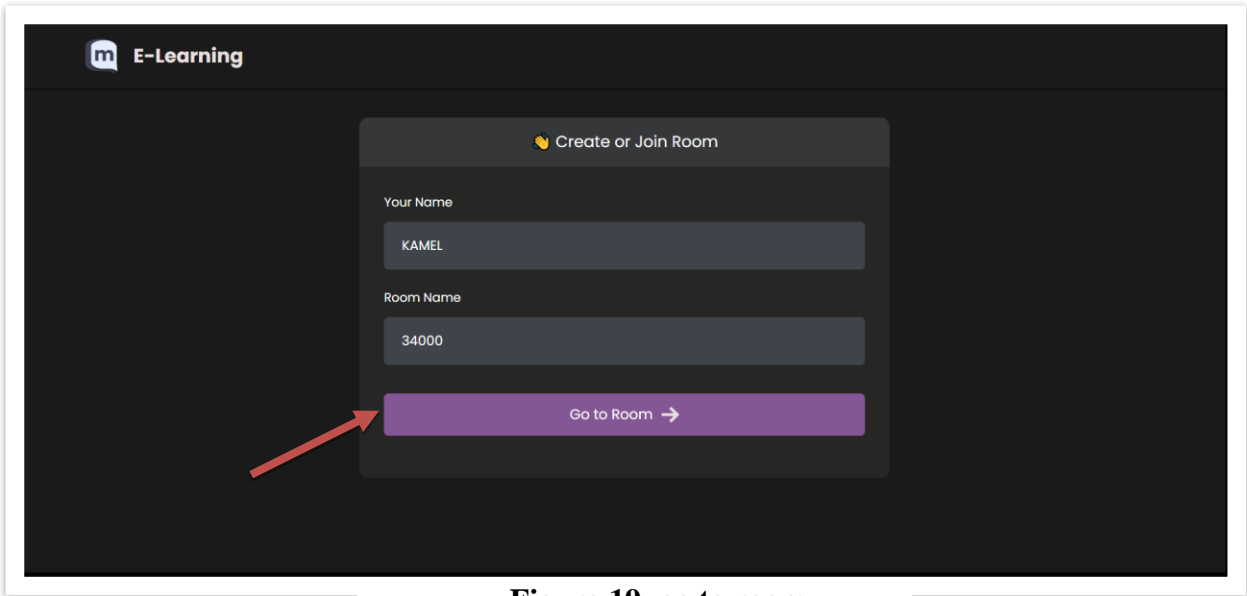

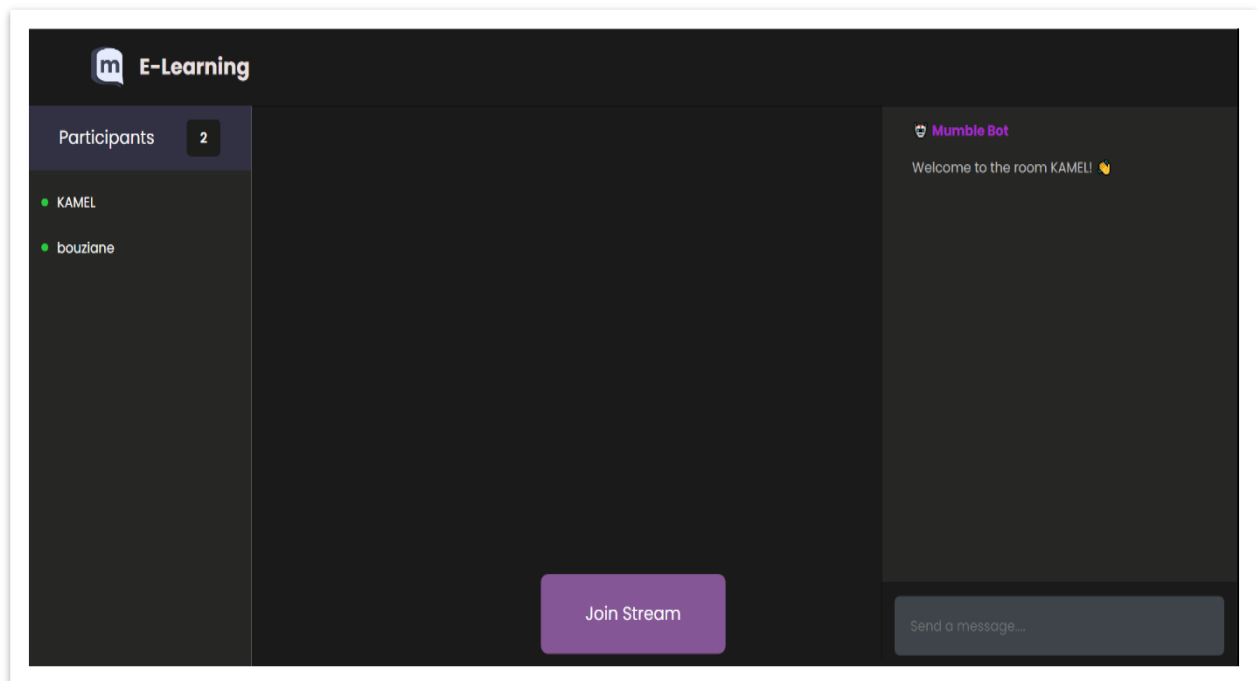
**Figure 18: list of room**

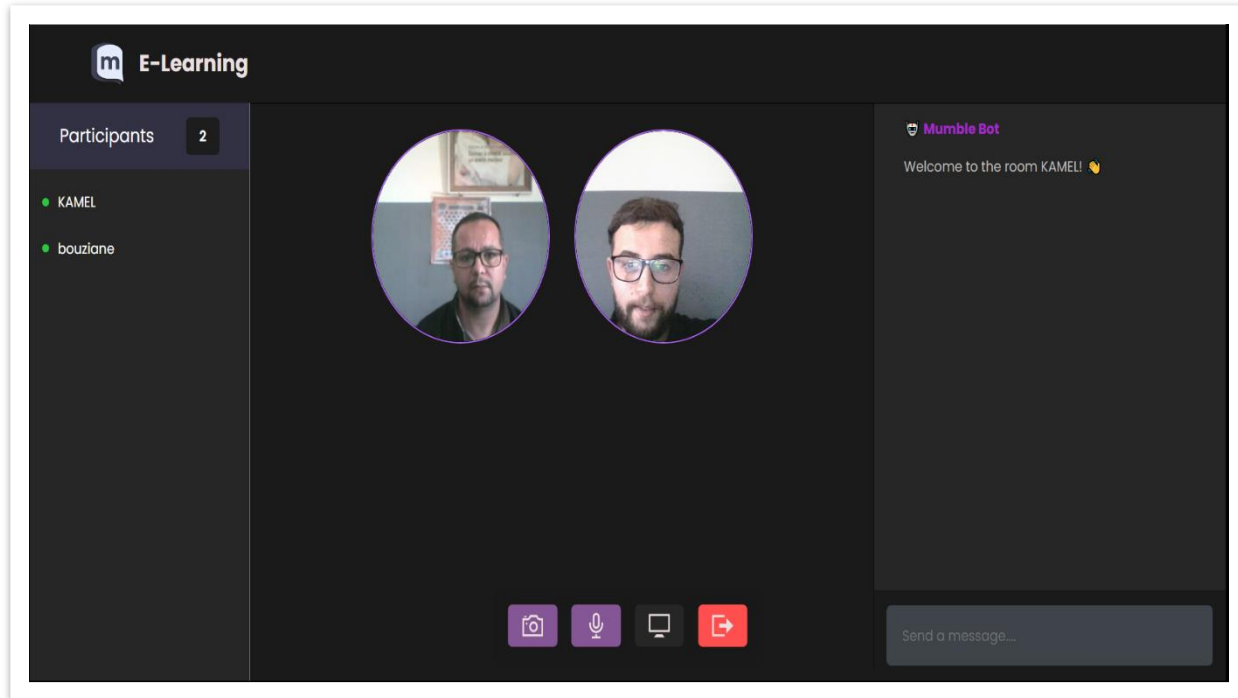


Figure 21: live

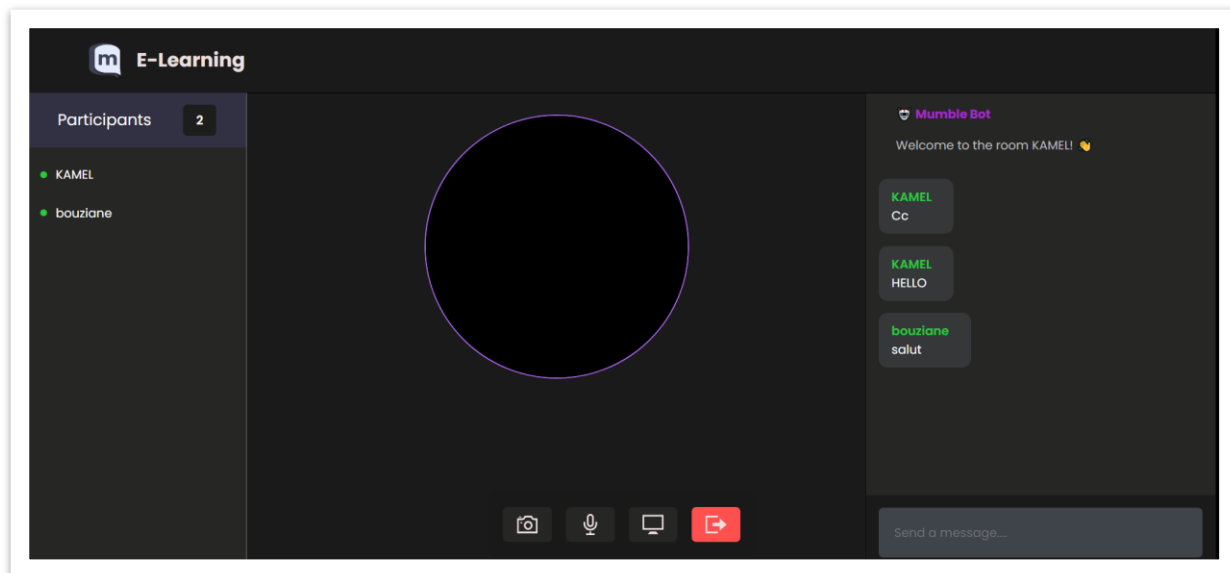


Figure 22 : home page of room

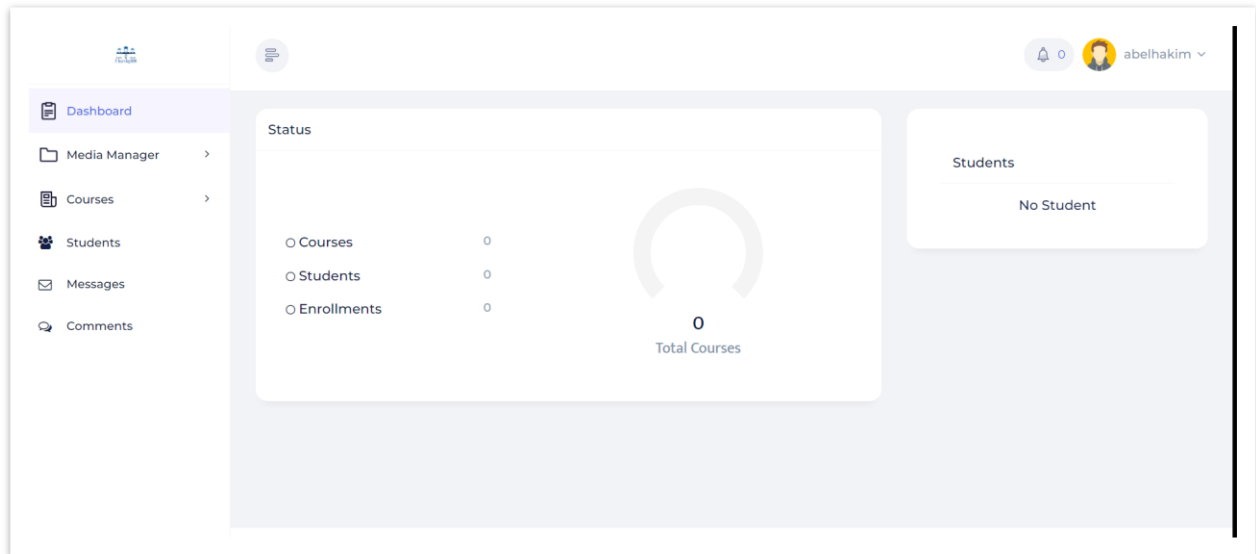

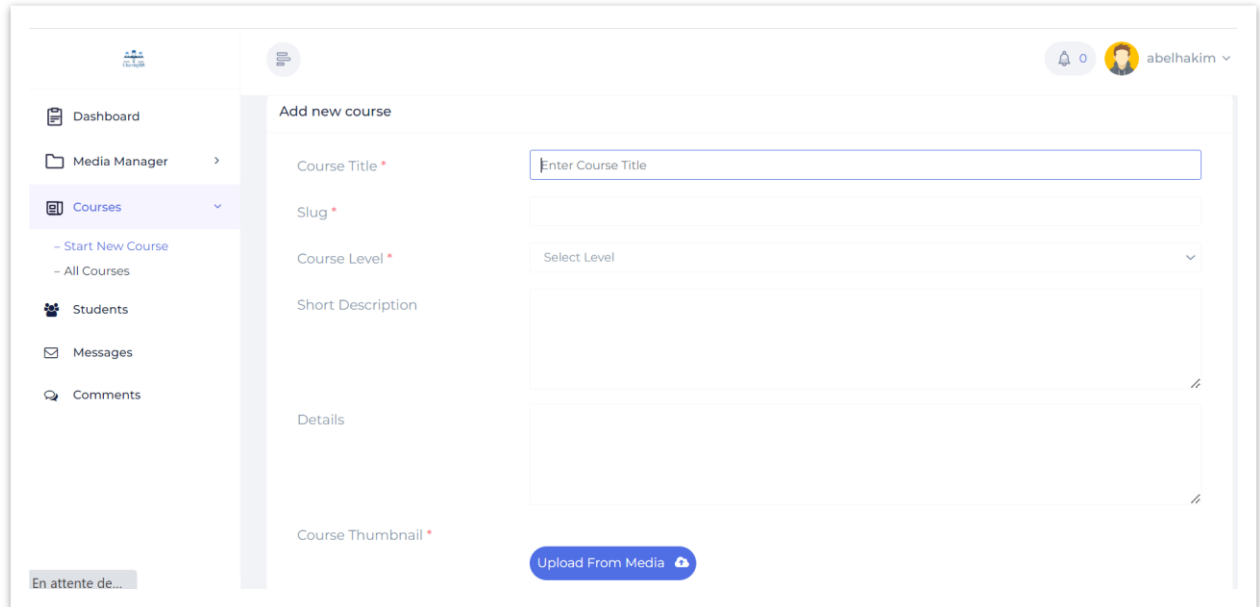

**Figure 23 : dashboard of teacher**

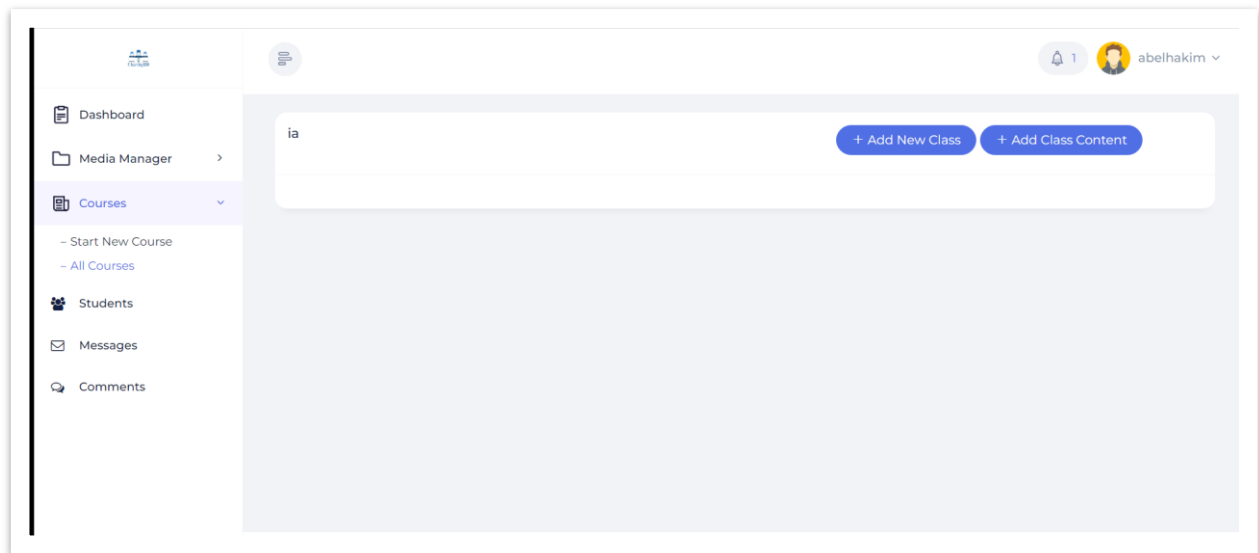

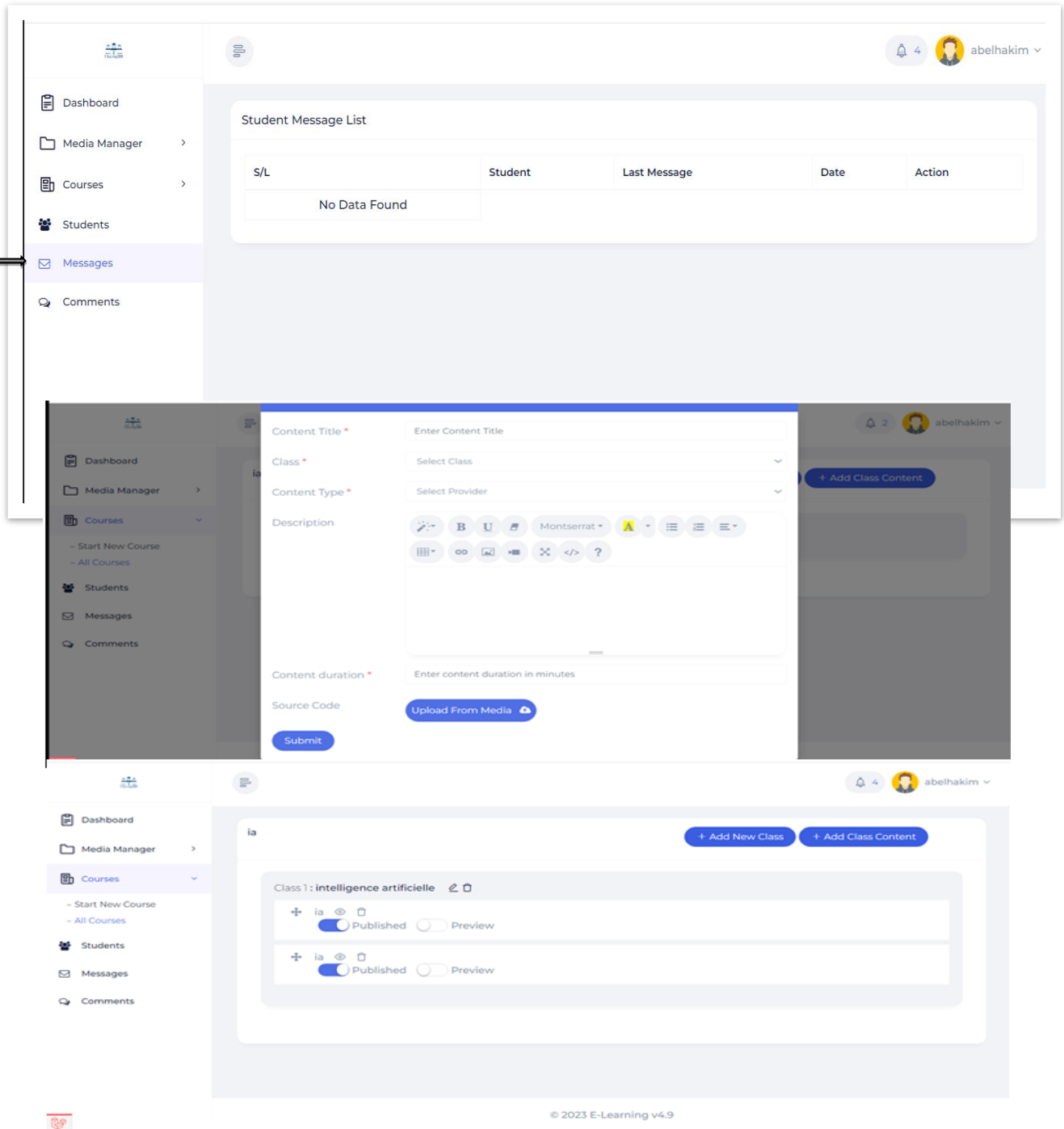


**Figure 25 : Add courses**

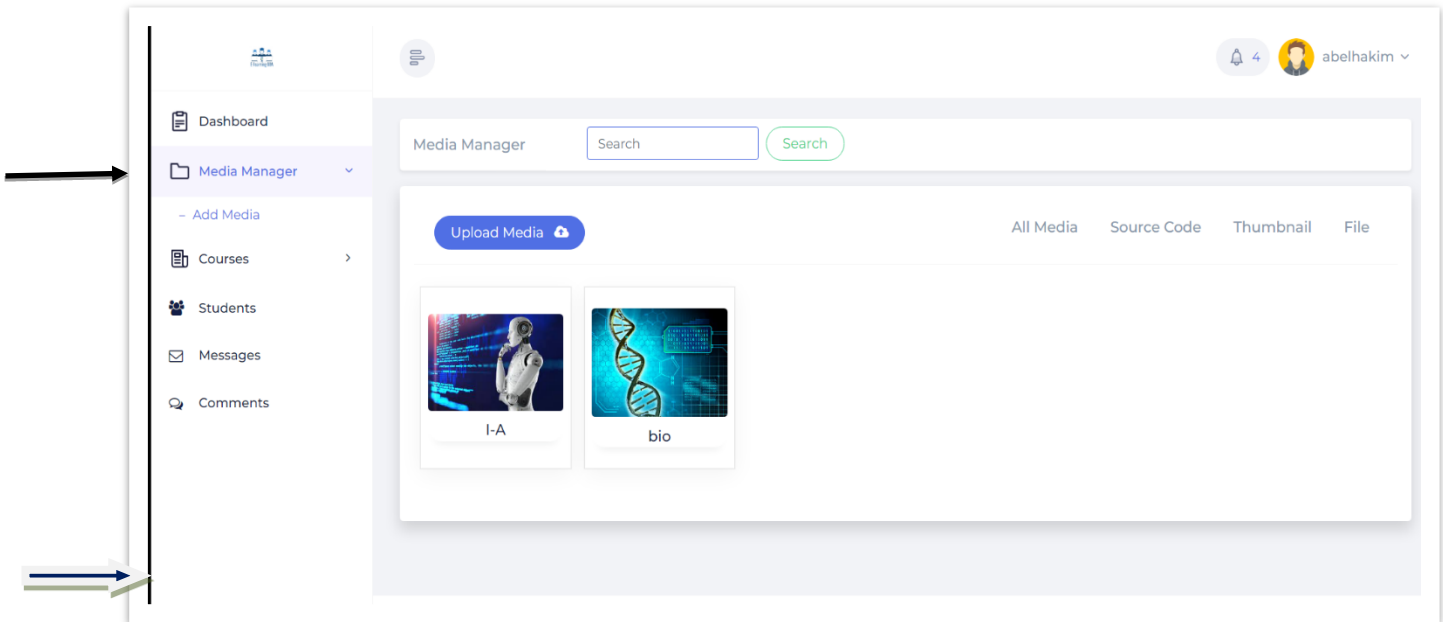


Figure 28:media manager.

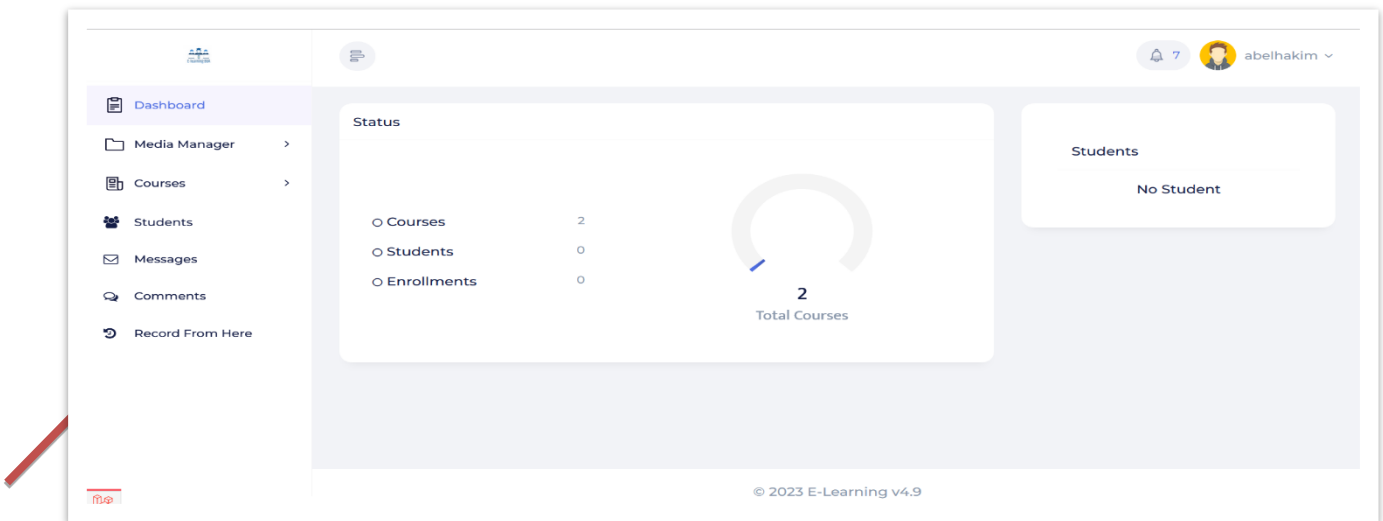


Figure 29 recording video.

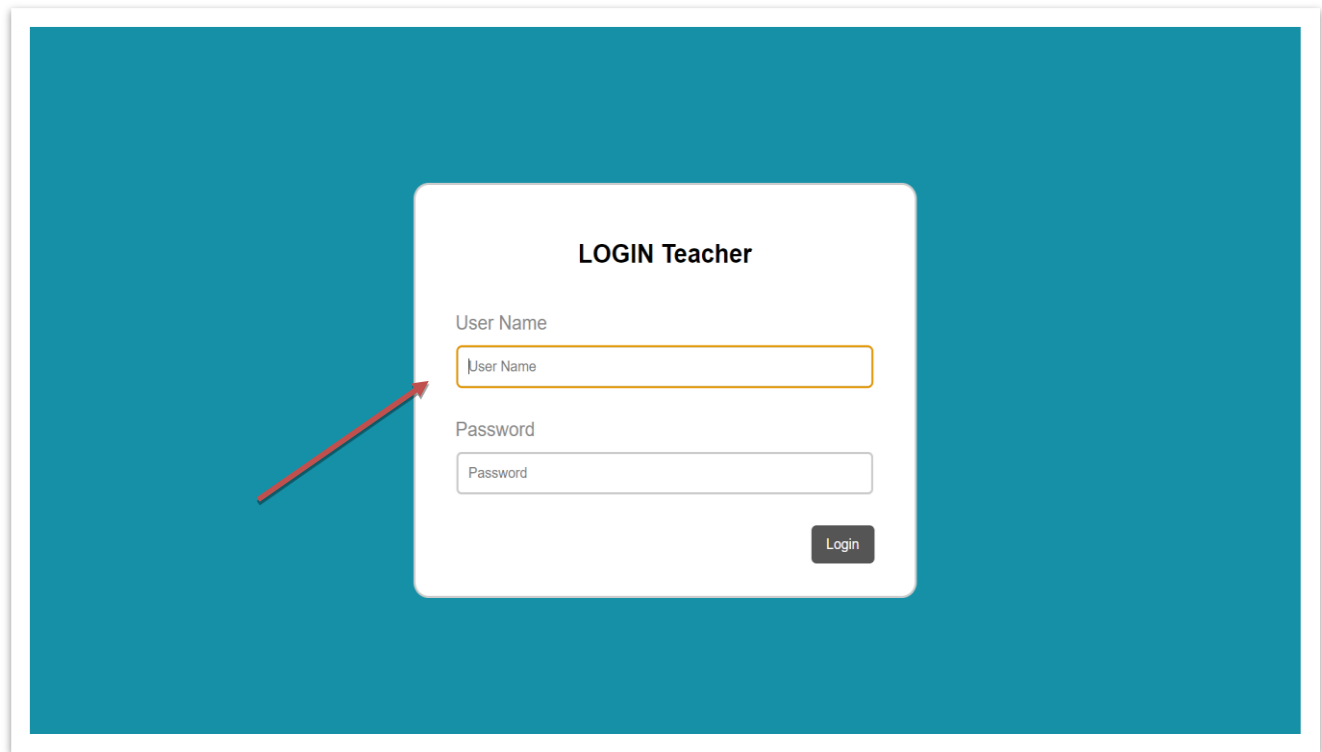


Figure 30 :login

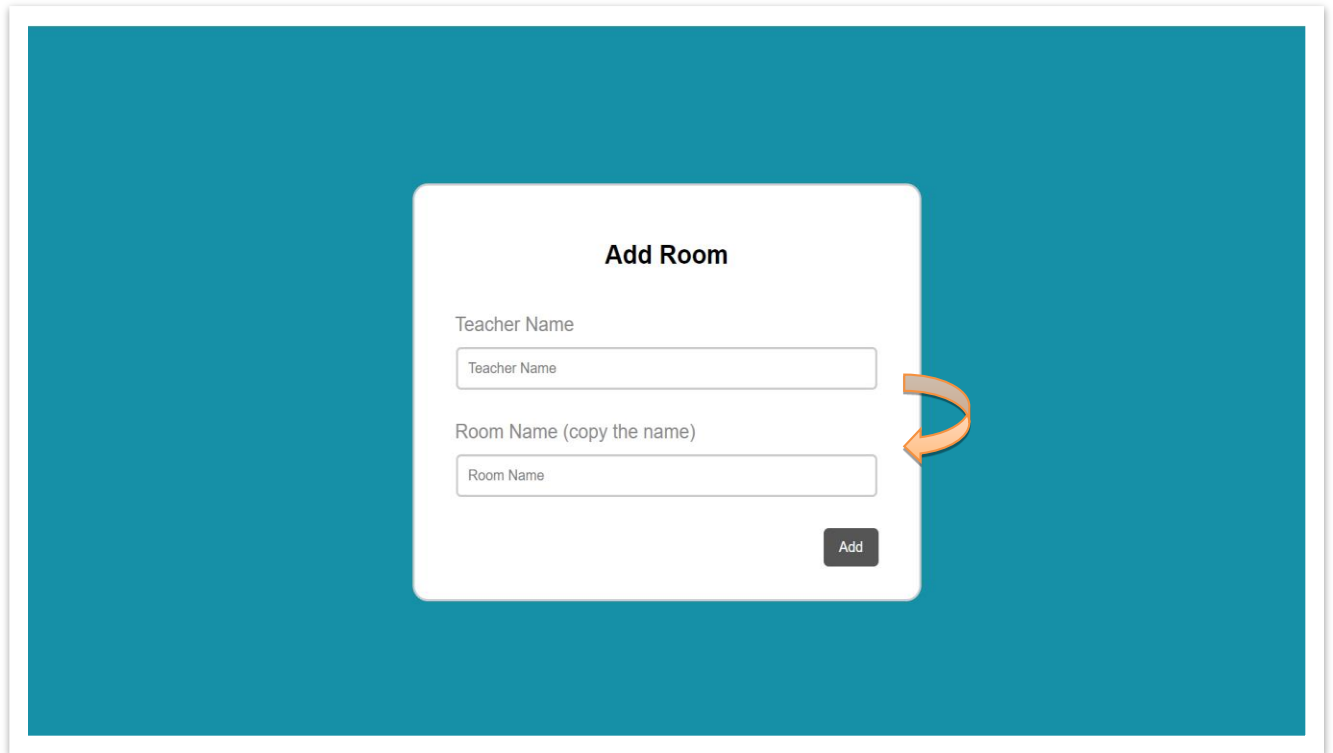
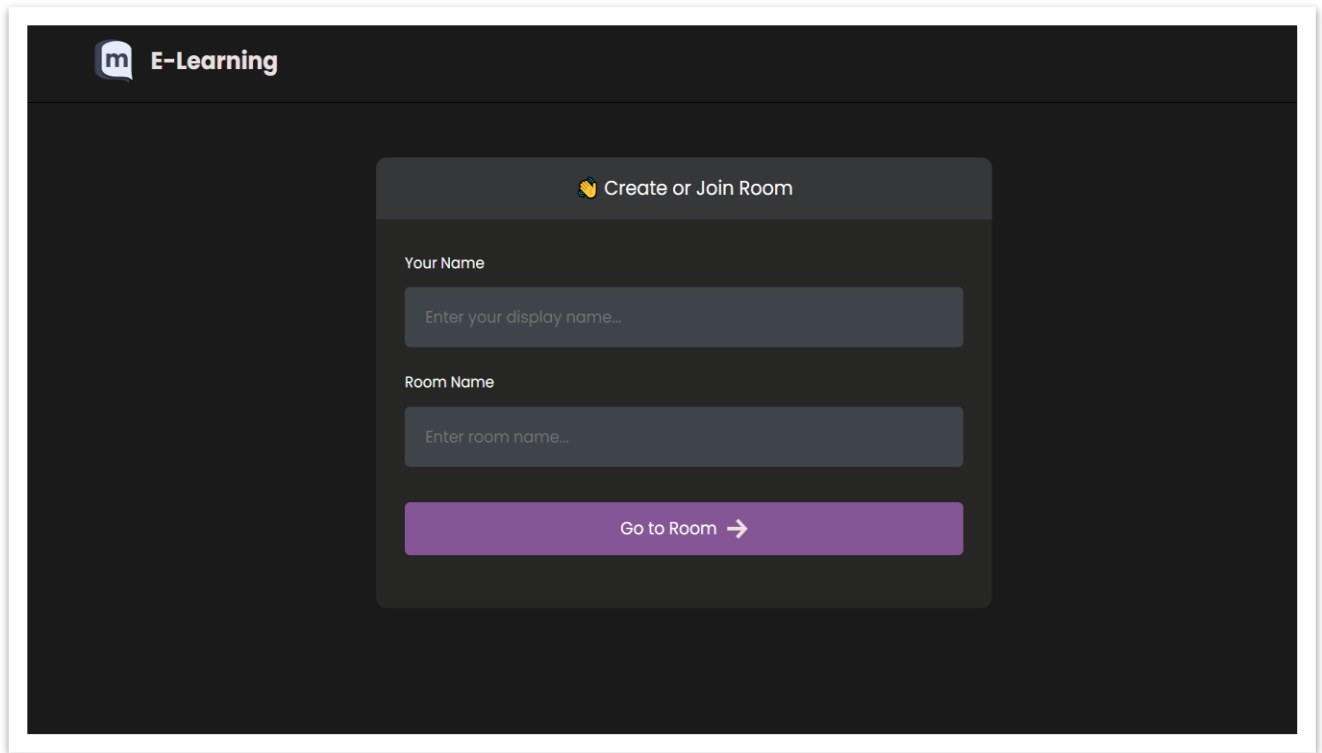

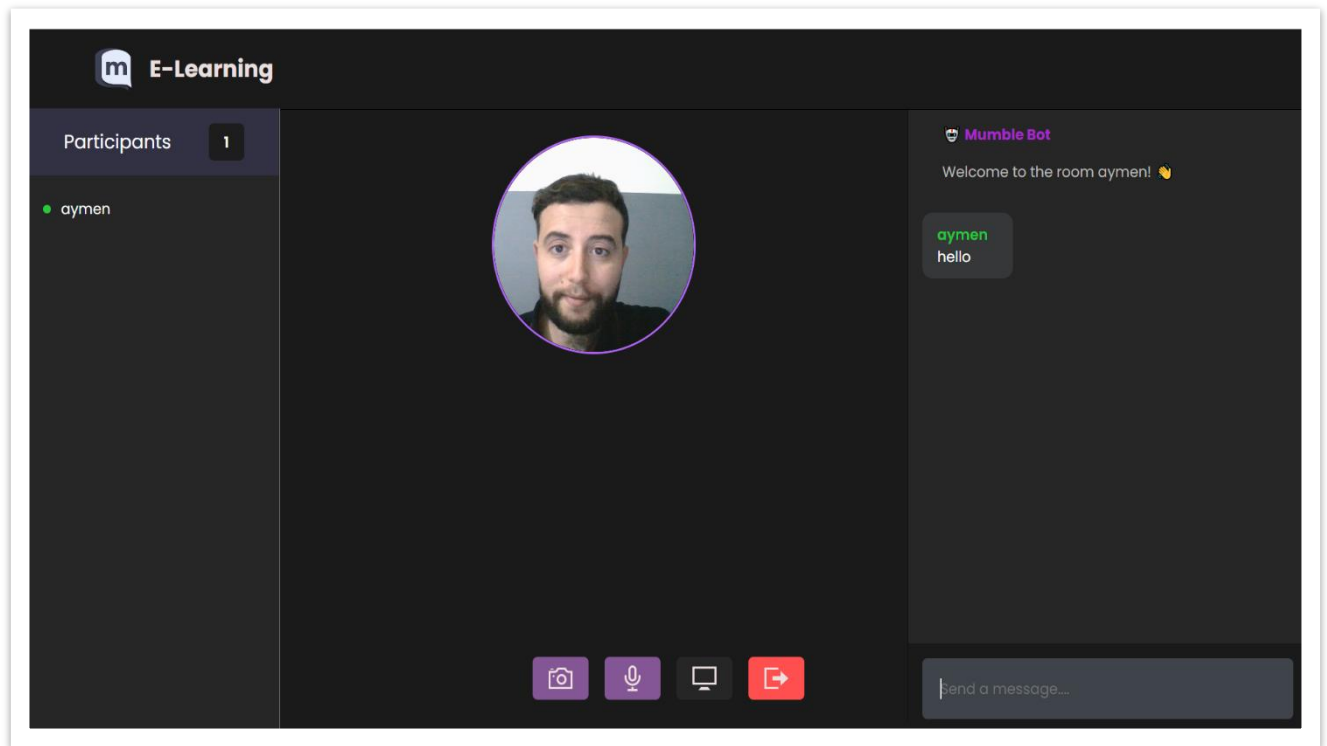
Figure 31 :add room
